Contractors:

The second semester has started for the students who are enrolled with FEAA, as well as a new first year class that started in January 2015. Please remind your apprentices for whom you sponsor how important the following areas are for them to succeed in the program.

Absences: According to the state standards of apprenticeship the students are required to complete 144 hours per year of related training. If the students fall short of these hours they will be required to repeat the year in which they are currently enrolled, or they will be de-indentured from the state. FEAA still requires the contractor to call into the office if their employee's who are attending school are going to be out for the night of training. **Work related absences are not an excused absence**, but it does become a factor should the board of directors have to determine if a student has to repeat or be dropped from the program.

Work Records: Turn their monthly WPS sheets in on time, so hours can be properly entered into our data base. If WPS are not turned in by the first week of the month due, the students will receive a 10 point deduction off their next scheduled test, and these points can not be made up.

Enrollment for September 2015 Apprenticeship Classes

FEAA is now accepting applications for fall 2015 enrollment. If you have employees, who have expressed an interest in the program, and you are willing to sponsor, or if you feel that you currently have an employee who would benefit from additional training, please have them contact our office Monday-Thursday to set up an appointment to complete an application. **Tuition will be \$450.00 per apprentice starting in September, 2015.**

They must bring the following documents with them for the interview process:

- Drivers License
- Social Security Card
- High School diploma or GED
- Any documentation to verify prior time in trade
